

Factors Influencing Increasing Youth Activity in New Uzbekistan

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Abstract:

The article analyzes the factors influencing the increase of youth activity in the new Uzbekistan and reflects on the importance of these processes.

In our country, large-scale work is being carried out in the field of state policy related to youth. In recent years, a special system has been created to provide comprehensive support to young people, to protect their rights and legal interests, and to educate enterprising and ambitious young people who are able to take responsibility for the future of our country.

The Youth Affairs Agency of the Republic of Uzbekistan, the Youth Parliaments under the Chambers of the Oliy Majlis, and the Youth Academy under the Ministry of Innovative Development of the Republic of Uzbekistan were established. "Project Factory" has started working in the regions.

Ensuring the healthy growth of the young generation, receiving quality education and growing up as a well-rounded person, as well as comprehensively fostering the interest of young people in culture, art, sports, information technologies and reading books Effective work is being done to introduce "five important initiatives" aimed at support.

New state and non-state pre-school educational organizations, general schools, higher educational institutions, branches of prestigious foreign universities, modern IT-parks, cultural institutions and sports facilities, completely new educational facilities being established in our country - "President schools", "School of Temurbeks", "Ijod schools" serve to educate a new generation of mature personnel who are able to compete in the conditions of today's globalization[1].

It is known from the historical development of any country that the rapid development of the country, the achievement of certain achievements, and the well-being of the people depend on the level of attention paid to the education and future of the youth in that country. In this sense, the issue of youth in Uzbekistan is one of the most priority areas of state policy.

A strong legal framework has been created in the country to protect the rights and interests of young people, to create the necessary conditions and opportunities for them, and this system is being improved in line with the requirements of the times. In particular, more than 40 legal

documents related to youth have been adopted by the parliament, and more than 30 international legal documents have been ratified.

Taking into account that we are living with the largest group of young people in the history of mankind, President Shavkat Mirziyoyev's proposal to adopt the UN Convention on the Rights of Youth was also warmly welcomed by the international community. Based on this, the head of Uzbekistan justified the fact that today the number of young people in the world has exceeded two billion, and the need to protect young people at a time when international terrorism and extremism are growing rapidly, as important factors.

Today, 1/3 of the world's population is made up of young people. In Uzbekistan, more than 18 million representatives of the younger generation are working in various spheres of society. These figures indicate that in the era of globalization in which we live, young people are becoming the most important and main force both in the world development and in the development of our country.

As UN Secretary General António Guterres said in his address dedicated to the International Youth Day on August 12, "The future of humanity lies in the incredible enthusiasm, dreams and ideas of the youth of the world and their efforts to make a worthy contribution to this noble goal." depends on his actions".

In addition to this idea, we can say that the future of humanity depends on the youth, and the future of every person depends on the efforts made in youth. A person strives to find a worthy place in society at a young age. He starts a career, builds a family, starts to seriously engage in the fields of science, art or sports. At this moment, he needs the support of the state and society more than ever. Because the choices made by a person in his youth have a strong influence on his destiny.

Youth is the spring of a person's life. If the seed sown in the spring is properly cared for, it will take firm root in the ground and give a bountiful harvest. After spring, what kind of harvest can be expected from the seed planted in the ground?

Today, there are many international documents, strategies and "roadmaps" aimed at supporting young people, protecting their rights, and creating conditions for representatives of the younger generation to show their talents and abilities. The Universal Declaration of Human Rights, recognized by all countries of the world and implemented in their national legislation, guarantees the basic fundamental rights of all people, including young people. Rights such as equality and freedom, access to quality education, access to medical services, privacy, property ownership, election and election, freedom of speech, opinion and conscience are firmly established in this universal document. The Universal Declaration of Human Rights, whose 75th anniversary will be celebrated on December 10 of this year, is the main program of the United Nations Organization.

Today, more than ever, the UN is paying more attention to ensuring the rights of young people and implementing targeted measures for young people. In particular, in order to meet the needs of the world's youth, strengthen their potential and fully ensure their rights, the UN "is being developed and implemented consistently. In this international strategy, 5 priority areas of the Youth 2030 strategy are defined:

the first direction is aimed at involving young people in solving modern problems, increasing the role of young people in achieving peace, justice and environmental security throughout the world;

the second direction envisages expanding the opportunity for all young people to receive quality education and use qualified medical services;

the third direction covers issues such as improving the economic situation of young people, creating jobs suitable for young people, improving the system of training, reducing the number of unemployed and uneducated young people;

the fourth direction serves to create conditions for young people to exercise their civil and political rights, to protect and encourage the rights of young people;

The fifth direction includes issues such as ensuring youth participation at all stages of the reform process, developing cooperation between state and non-state organizations dealing with youth issues.

As a member of the United Nations, our country also attaches great importance to strengthening the normative foundations of youth rights by implementing the tasks defined in the "Youth 2030" strategy, achieving the goals of sustainable development, implementing the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and other international legal documents into our national legislation. If we analyze the work carried out within the framework of the state policy on youth in Uzbekistan in recent years, we are sure that significant results have been achieved in this regard.

First, regulatory documents guaranteeing the rights of young people have been improved. The first law signed by the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan Shavkat Mirziyoyev as the head of our country is the law "On State Policy Regarding Youth". In the last eight years, more than 100 normative legal documents related to youth have been adopted in our country and are being consistently implemented. A number of norms related to youth rights were included in the newly revised Constitution of the Republic of Uzbekistan.

Secondly, the activities of new organizational structures working with young people were launched. In particular, the Youth Affairs Agency and the interdepartmental council on youth issues under the chairmanship of the Prime Minister have started work. A commission on youth issues was established in the Legislative Chamber of the Oliy Majlis, and a Youth Parliament was established under the chambers of the Oliy Majlis.

Thirdly, national strategies and programs were adopted in order to ensure systematic and consistent measures. Strategy of actions on five priority areas of development of the Republic of Uzbekistan in 2017-2021, Development strategy of New Uzbekistan for 2022-2026, National strategy of the Republic of Uzbekistan on human rights, Five important initiatives of the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan are among them.

Fourthly, a new system of working with young people who are struggling to find their place in society and need special attention and support was introduced. That is, the "Youth register" was established and a list of young people in need of assistance was formed. The scope of aid provided to our compatriots, included in it, is increasing year by year. In the last two years, about 798 thousand young people have been provided with financial assistance worth about 1 trillion soums, including 53 thousand students from needy families have been paid contract money for studying. Also, the establishment of youth leader activities in every neighborhood of our country contributes to increasing the efficiency of working with young people.

Fifth, wide opportunities are provided for young people to learn. The higher education system was reformed and the entrance exams became transparent. An increase in the number of Dorylfununs and correspondingly the level of coverage has been achieved. Preferential educational loans are allocated for young students studying on the basis of the contract. Women studying at the master's degree are receiving education on the basis of a full grant. At the same time, the "El-yurt umidi" fund was established, and an opportunity was created for talented young men and women to study in prestigious higher education institutions abroad.

Sixth, efforts aimed at moral and material stimulation of creative youth have increased. In particular, a national competition for the "Ilhom" award was established in order to support

young artists studying in higher educational institutions. The "Yosh Kitabkhan" competition encourages millions of young people to read. In front of the new and modern building of the Union of Writers of Uzbekistan, on Adiblar Avenue, various literary conferences are regularly organized for young writers. As part of the "My First Book" project, the first book of dozens of young artists is published for free every year.

Seventh, promotion of a healthy lifestyle and sports among young people, support of young athletes is in the constant focus of our state's attention. In the first half of this year, Uzbek sportsmen have won 247 gold, 119 silver and 110 bronze medals. This is a reflection of the systematic work carried out by our country on the development of sports and its popularization among young people, as well as the creation of modern sports facilities.

Eighth, ample opportunities are being created for young people to engage in entrepreneurial activities. In particular, in the last three years, 210 "Youth industrial and entrepreneurship zones" have been established in our country, and more than 2,500 projects have been implemented in them. Preferential loans are provided to young entrepreneurs on favorable terms.

Ninthly, priority is given to social support of young families. In order to help them provide housing, subsidies are allocated and every young family is constantly encouraged in the neighborhood. [3].
